Description

The Credit Suisse Securities Division offers two separate full time analyst programs – one in Equity Sales and Trading and one in Fixed Income Sales and Trading. Managers from both businesses will review your application and you will be interviewed by whichever business area select your application. Please only drop your resume once for these programs.

As an Equities Analyst, you may be exposed to multiple functions (Sales, Salestrading, Trading or Structuring) and products (Cash, CB and Derivatives, Prime Services) throughout your Analyst career. Depending on the area to which you are placed or rotating through, some of your responsibilities may include eliciting Credit Suisse research opinions, formulating sales and trading strategies, liaising with clients and executing trades. Whether you are part of the team that puts in a trade or develop a customized product for the client, what matters is the opportunity provided to take on as much responsibility as you can handle in encouraging and supporting your long term growth and development. Our opportunities are primarily in Hong Kong.

Our Fixed Income services incorporate underwriting, research, and sales and trading of instruments that span the credit spectrum, including government and corporate bonds, money markets, foreign exchange, commodities and derivative products. Our capabilities range from staging plain vanilla financings to delivering advice on liability management, structured finance, and hedging and derivatives. Our opportunities are primarily in Hong Kong and Singapore.

Our Analyst program is designed to enable Analysts to become familiar with the Sales and Trading arena as well as the overall investment process, gaining a broad and varied view of several potential career paths.

Training

The Securities Analyst Program provides the foundation necessary for a successful career. As a new Analyst, you will receive intensive classroom training for 4-5 weeks in one of our major financial hubs as part of the Securities Training Program. Components of your training will include: an orientation to the Firm, financial math and accounting "boot camp", capital markets overview, accounting, valuation, buy-side, overview of global debt and equity markets and instruments, introduction to the various desks and training in presentation skills, computer systems and applications. At our many social and networking events, you will make business contacts from around the Firm globally. You will also be paired with a mentor to ensure your smooth transition into the world of Equities.

Beyond initial classroom training, throughout your career you will have plenty of opportunities to participate in development and training programs developed by our internal Talent Development Team which will help you further hone your soft and technical skills.

Qualifications

To apply for this position, you must be a graduating senior (graduating in December 2011 or May/June 2012) at a four-year college/university or a masters program. Credit Suisse is noted for the diversity of its employees, but seeks candidates with a common set of abilities – highly motivated and creative individuals who have demonstrated academic achievement, and have the ability to work independently and as a member of a team.
